Try playing this Spanish piece inspired by Rodrigo








Could you write a melody in a Spanish style?

The Rosette

The pattern that is around you guitars sound hole is called a 'rosette' and is traditionally found on Spanish guitars. Every maker has their own unique design. If you look carefully you can see that it is made up of lots of tiny squares. Can you design your own rosette? Try and find other examples of rosettes.
