Let's see if we can conjure up some 3 magic by mixing up first position and third position notes to create a tune...


How to play our 'Magical' tune...

TOP TIP! Before you start, buzz your lips to get them warm, make sure you are sitting up straight, and take a nice big breath to make sure you sound great!



When you see a / wand, play a note in position one (closed) doesn't matter which, you choose!

When you see a play a note in position 3, the magic number! When you see an empty box take a rest!



Fantastic!


