Year 4

Children in Year 4 will learn more about tropical rainforests this week, discovering who lives there. They'll be introduced to a new text, which will help them with their new learning. They'll also continue to explore the rainforest in their dance lessons.

Year 6 children will continue to improve their knowledge of Islam and the Islamic Empire. They'll be considering what it would be like to live in the desert. They'll also compare the Golden Age of Islam with London in the Dark Ages - which will they prefer? They'll also learn more about Islamic architecture.

Year 1 children will continue learning about the weather this week. In PSHE, they'll be thinking about how to solve friendship issues for themselves.







Year 3 children have a very busy week. They will continue to learn about magnetism in science. They'll continue exploring how land is used in their local area and will identify physical features of the landscape.

The children will be introduced to a significant figure from history this week; learning about Boudica and her place in history.
